WELCOME

It is with great pleasure that Harvey Senior High School (HSHS), in partnership with the School Board, presents the 2024 Annual Report to our school community. This report provides a clear and transparent overview of HSHS's strengths, challenges, and areas for improvement, marking the culmination of the 2022–2024 School Business Plan.

We are pleased to report that student numbers remain steady at 273 at the first-semester census, a 30% increase in student population since 2021. This improvement reflects the unwavering commitment of our staff and local community in forging strong connections among students, parents/caregivers, and the school, ensuring that all students are supported in achieving their potential.

In 2024, the school underwent a significant external evaluation to validate our achievements and provide recommendations for future improvement. The Public School Review, conducted by the Department of **Education Public School Accountability** Directorate, commended our "focus on enhancing collective staff efficacy in meeting the needs of students through a culture in which decisions are data-driven, teaching practices are evidence-based, and resources and processes are aligned to build capacity in an environment of trust and respect." The report further acknowledged "the efforts of the school in creating the conditions for successful students."

We are very proud of this positive review, which validates the dedication of our staff. Moreover, the review process identified several areas for growth that will inform the development of the new School Business Plan (2025–2027), ensuring that our school continues to support the development and success of every student, now and into the future.

In addition to the Public School Review, our financial and resource management were examined during the School Compliance Review (Audit) conducted by the Department of Education Financial Services Directorate. I was extremely pleased with the audit findings, which awarded the school an overall rating of "Good." This positive outcome confirms our sound financial, budgetary, and resource management practices and offers us an opportunity to respond proactively to any recommendations moving forward.

As part of our annual school review processes, we measure the culture and organizational health of our school through an external proprietary diagnostic tool. We have demonstrated significant growth and development in our organizational culture over recent years, progressing from the second quartile in 2022 to consistently ranking in the top quartile against the global benchmark in 2024. This positive trajectory is a direct result of the hard work and dedication of our staff, supported by our broader school community.

On behalf of the staff at HSHS and the School Board, I would like to thank the entire school community for your support, professionalism, and commitment to ensuring every child succeeds. Your engagement guarantees that HSHS will continue to move forward positively in one common direction.



Total student numbers at Harvey Senior High School continued to grow in 2024, reaching 277 in Semester Two. This reflects a 32% increase in student population since 2020 (up from 209 students), marking a steady upward trend over the past four years. This growth includes sustained increases in both Lower Secondary (Years 7–10), which now totals 209 students, and an encouraging rise in the Upper Secondary (Years 11–12) cohort to 68 students—a notable improvement from just 42 in 2022. The strengthening of our Senior School numbers is particularly positive, as it reflects greater retention and engagement of students as they progress through their schooling. We believe these figures are a testament to the growing confidence of our community in the quality of education offered at Harvey Senior High School and the increasing relevance of our senior secondary pathways.

The overall staffing profile at Harvey Senior High School continues to align closely with the priorities and programs offered across the school. As of 2023 Semester 2, total student enrolments have grown to 277, marking a 32% increase since 2020.

To support this growth, the school employs 48 staff across administration, teaching, and support roles, equating to 41.3 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions. The leadership structure includes four administration staff (4.0 FTE), ensuring sufficient oversight across all areas of school operations. A total of 25 teaching staff (23.6 FTE) deliver quality learning experiences, while 19 support staff (13.6 FTE) provide essential services across administration, maintenance, and student support.

With enrolment numbers trending upward, long-term workforce planning is underway to ensure that staffing levels and capabilities remain responsive to student needs and aligned with the school's strategic direction.



Student attendance remains an ongoing area of focus for Harvey Senior High School. While still impacted by lingering effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and broader social disengagement trends, 2024 data indicates continued efforts to stabilise and improve attendance patterns across all cohorts.

In 2024, overall school attendance sits at 77.8%, slightly below the WA Public School average of 80.4%, but above the Like Schools average of 75%. Encouragingly, Aboriginal student attendance at Harvey SHS is 69.4%, which is significantly higher than both Like Schools (58.8%) and the WA Public Schools average (55.2%)—reflecting the success of targeted engagement strategies and community partnerships.

Analysis of attendance categories shows that 29.5% of students are attending regularly, a slight decrease from 2023 (32.0%), yet our rate of severe at-risk attendance (15.6%) remains better than Like Schools (19.9%). While we remain below the WA Public Schools benchmark for regular attendance (48.0%), our school continues to perform better than Like Schools in several risk categories, including lower percentages in the moderate and severe risk bands.

In response, the school has undertaken a comprehensive review of its attendance policies and practices, embedding streamlined procedures and enhancing student engagement strategies. Regular communication with families emphasises the critical connection between attendance and learning progress. The school remains firmly committed to improving attendance across all categories working in partnership with parents, caregivers, and support agencies to promote consistent student attendance across all year levels.

Harvey Senior High School continues to track student achievement and progress through stable cohort data and comparative analysis against Like Schools and WA Public Schools. The 2024 NAPLAN results indicate solid achievement in several areas, particularly in Year 7 Spelling (530), which was well above Like Schools (507) and aligned closely with the WA Public Schools average (535). Similarly, Year 7 Numeracy (504) and Reading (504) were above Like Schools (494 and 489 respectively), showing strength in foundational learning for lower secondary students.

In contrast, the Year 9 results highlight areas for improvement. Students performed below Like Schools and WA Public Schools in all five assessed areas: Numeracy, Reading, Writing, Spelling, and Grammar & Punctuation. For instance, Year 9 Reading was 518, compared to 538 in Like Schools and 566 in WA Public Schools, while Numeracy (537) was just behind Like Schools (536) but significantly below the state average (565). These results suggest a need to strengthen engagement and progress in middle secondary, particularly in literacy-related domains.

While the school did not meet its 2024 KPI of equalling or exceeding Like Schools in at least four out of five areas in Year 9, the Year 7 cohort's strong performance presents a promising foundation for future improvement. To address these challenges, Harvey SHS will continue to invest in targeted literacy and numeracy support programs, enhanced instructional strategies, and staff development. The goal remains to support all students to achieve expected progress from Years 7 to 9, and to close the achievement gap with both Like Schools and WA Public Schools.

Harvey Senior High School has continued to make strong progress in supporting students to meet the literacy and numeracy requirements of the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (OLNA). In 2024, 93% of Year 12 students met the OLNA standard, a substantial increase from 83% in 2023, and well above the school's target of 75%, achieving the school's aspirational goal of exceeding 90%.

This consistent improvement over the past four years—from 77% in 2021 to 93% in 2024—reflects the sustained impact of targeted interventions, structured OLNA Support programs, and early identification of at-risk students. These strategies have enabled timely assistance and greater confidence among students completing the assessments.

The 2024 achievement is not only the highest recorded in recent years but also demonstrates that the school's literacy and numeracy support systems are effectively embedded and responsive to student needs. Moving forward, continued focus on early intervention and consolidation of support structures will be essential to maintaining this momentum and ensuring every student is positioned for success in their post-school pathways.

In 2024, Harvey Senior High School achieved a WACE achievement rate of 96%, with 24 of 25 eligible students meeting all requirements—well above the Like Schools average of 83% and exceeding the WA Public Schools average of 90%. This result meets and surpasses the school's aspirational KPI of maintaining WACE achievement above 90% and reflects the school's continued commitment to supporting all students through to successful graduation.

A detailed review of achievement standards shows outstanding performance across all components of the WACE. All students met the Breadth and Depth, English, and ATAR/Cert II/General pathway requirements (100%). The C grade requirement was met by 96% of students, and 24 of 25 students (96%) satisfied the literacy and numeracy standard, consistent with OLNA results.

These strong outcomes demonstrate the success of the school's tailored academic and vocational pathways, early intervention strategies, and close tracking of student progress. The sustained improvement over the past four years underscores Harvey Senior High School's effective approach to preparing students for life beyond school.

In 2024, 92% of VET-enrolled students successfully completed their certificate qualifications, surpassing the school's minimum benchmark of 90% and reflecting a strong and consistent performance across recent years. Although the aspirational target of 97% or higher was not reached, the current result represents continued success in delivering vocational education opportunities that are both accessible and relevant to student interests and career pathways.

The data also shows an encouraging distribution across certificate levels, with 24 students (67%) achieving a Certificate II, another achieving a Certificate III and one student achieving a Certificate IV. Furthermore, several students demonstrated exceptional engagement by completing multiple qualifications—11% of students completed two or more Certificates, including one student who completed three or more. Students continue to access a wide range of VET opportunities through diverse and flexible pathways. These include school-based delivery through the Senior School Engagement Program, external partnerships via VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VETDSS) with South Regional TAFE, the Bunbury Regional Trade Training Centre (BRTTC), and school-based traineeships with local industry partners. These strategic partnerships and multiple access points ensure that students are developing industry-relevant skills while working towards meaningful post-school outcomes.



SCHOOL INCOME BY FUNDING SOURCE

At Harvey Senior High School, financial operations are overseen by the Finance Committee, comprising the Principal, Manager Corporate Services, and four additional staff members. This committee is responsible for approving, monitoring, and reviewing the school's finances to ensure transparency and alignment with strategic goals. Funding priorities are identified through school planning and review processes and are embedded in the school's Business Plan, which is endorsed by the School Board.

The annual school budget is developed to ensure that expenditure directly supports the priorities outlined in the Business Plan. The Finance Committee also makes formal recommendations to the School Board regarding contributions and charges, which are reviewed and approved accordingly. Asset replacement schedules are maintained and updated regularly to ensure forward planning for essential equipment that supports student learning.

The School Board receives regular financial reports, including detailed accounts of both cash flow and staffing expenditures, as well as any approved use of reserve funds.

In 2023, the school underwent a Compliance Review (Audit) by the Department of Education's Financial Services Directorate. I was very pleased with the outcome, which resulted in an overall rating of "Good." This positive evaluation affirms the school's sound financial, budgeting, and resource management practices, and provides a valuable opportunity to respond proactively to any recommendations for further improvement.


