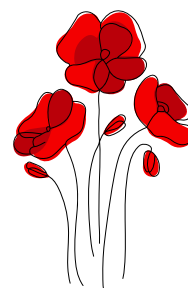

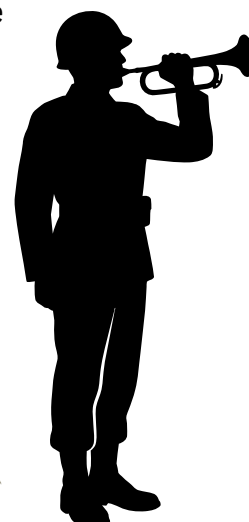


ANZAC DAY

ATHLETICS CARNIVAL

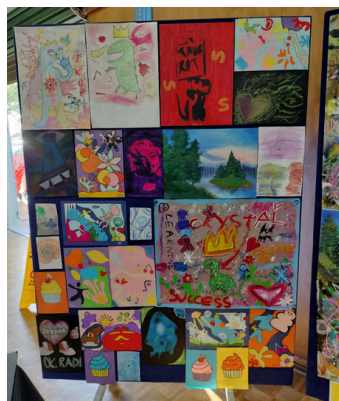

REPORTING

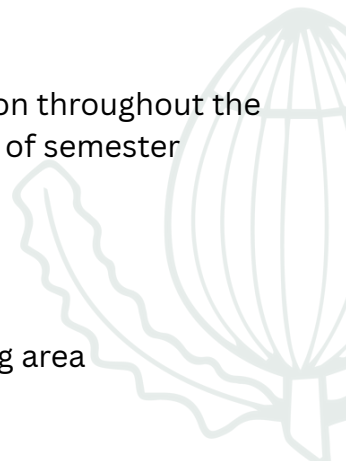
I would like to let all parents and carers know about changes to end of semester reporting as mandated by the Department of Education. These changes are now in effect, as you will see in the Semester 1 reports at the end of Term 2.

The Department of Education has introduced consistent reporting requirements for all schools. These changes are designed to make reports meaningful and easier to understand and consistent across all public schools.

We’ve complemented this change with increased opportunities for communication throughout the year through task-mark reports to enable greater engagement and feedback. End of semester reports will continue to highlight your child’s strengths and achievements.

Semester reports for all students will provide:

- a grade for each learning area studied
- information on your child’s attitude, behaviour and effort (ABE) for each learning area
- an overall comment to assist you in the interpretation of grades and ABE data



We will continue to offer opportunities to meet and talk with your child's teacher. Please be assured that, if it is identified that there is an issue with your child's progress and achievement, you will be informed in a timely manner, and you are invited to contact the school at any time if you have any concerns.

Thank you for your continued support of Harvey Senior High School. I look forward to a successful term ahead as we continue to work together to support our students to achieve their best.
